

All lifeguards at Outback Splash hold a Royal Life Saving WA Pool Lifeguard qualification (or equivalent) as a minimum, ensuring our team is well-equipped to maintain guest safety. Each year, we enhance our safety protocols with additional training led by Matt Nelson from National Aquatic Safety Services (NAQUATICSS). This training goes beyond standard lifeguard techniques, incorporating best practices from both local and international standards, specifically adapted for our waterpark's unique features.

Matt's sessions focus on advanced scanning strategies and emergency response tactics, tailored to the specific challenges and layout of our attractions. This ensures our lifeguards are not just qualified, but also prepared for any situation.

Additionally, our Lagoon Pool features an observation tower, strategically designed to give lifeguards an elevated vantage point. This ensures they have an unobstructed view over the entire pool area, significantly improving their ability to oversee Guest safety and respond quickly to any incidents.

Through ongoing training and a clear focus on high standards, Outback Splash aims to offer a safe, fun experience for everyone.

Outback Splash requests that each student group is closely supervised by a member of your supervisory team. To assist, Outback Splash provides free entry for supervisors at the ratio of 1:8 for primary students and 1:10 for secondary students.

Please note the following is a W.A Education Department requirement - Schools are required to provide an adult supervisor qualified with Bronze Medallion qualification or higher for the student ratio of 1:32 or part thereof. If a school is unable to meet the qualified supervisor ratio, **Royal Life Saving WA Lifeguard Services** can be engaged to provide additional supervision for their group.
